



itemized bill, don't forget to ask the landlord!




GODS, SUPERSTITION, AND MAGIC

In antiquity people believed that divinities were omnipresent. Greek and Roman gods and goddesses, as well as local and pre-Roman divinities, were invoked on many altars and in various dedications. The fact that dedications to them were inscribed on stone altars points to their 'Romanization', as this was a typically Roman way of worshipping deities. Some pre-Roman sites of cult activity have been discovered in the northern Adriatic and eastern Alpine regions, where various votive objects were ritually deposited, and such places are also known to exist in the Emona (Ljubljana) area, along the river Ljubljanica.
